## Deaths 3 580

- A total of **135 951** cases have been recorded to-date, representing **5%** of the total population **(2 550 226)**.
- More female cases 72 428 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 649 (3%) are Health Workers, with 24 new confirmations today.
  - 3 877 (83%) State; 764 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 4 361 (94%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.

## Death(s) 0

- > The recovery rate now stands at 92.9%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 45 791 (34%) and 19 476 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 279 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 301 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.6%.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 15 December 2021

- The highest peak of 12 787 (9%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 434 in epi-week 49.
- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- ➤ Today (15/12/2021), **508** calls were answered.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 15 December 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 81 627 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 22 223 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 15 797 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 011 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 13 293 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of nineteen (19) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center.
- To date, 828 465 tests (including 15 336 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 151 097 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 876 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 147 365 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 25 818 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 857 (43%) out of 1 975 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 15 December 2021

- Since March 2020, 83 639 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 390 people are currently in quarantine, with 258 new admissions.
