- > A daily increase of confirmed cases continue to be observed with concern and among them, majority are still not vaccinated. In the same vein we continue to observe increased hospitalized cases including those in ICU.
- A total of 145 637 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 6% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 77 380 (53%) have been recorded.

Deaths 3 610

- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 979 (3%) are Health Workers, with 33 new confirmations today.
  - 4 179 (84%) State; 792 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 4 579 (93%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 89%.
- ▶ Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 48 958 (34%) and 21 210 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 299 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 311 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The case fatality rate now stands at 2.5%.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 24 December 2021

- The highest peak of 12 787 (9%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 918 in epi-week 49.
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- ➤ Today (24/12/2021), 535 calls were answered.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 24 December 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 88 562 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 23 077 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 16 754 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 160 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 14 084 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of twenty (20) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center & Oshana Med Laboratory.
- To date, 860 787 tests (including 16 590 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 155 834 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified,
   146 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 6 regions.
- Cumulatively, 151 004 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 26 586 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 288 (9%) out of 3 157 active contacts were monitored.


