- A daily increase of confirmed cases continue to be observed with concern and among them, majority are still not vaccinated . In the same vein we continue to observe increased hospitalized cases including those in ICU.
- A total of 146 097 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 6% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 77 587 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 987 (3%) are Health Workers, with 8 new confirmations today.
 - 4 187 (84%) State; 792 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 579 (93%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 89%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 49 039 (34%) and 21 296 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 299 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 312 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The case fatality rate now stands at 2.5%.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 25 December 2021

- ➤ The highest peak of 12 787 (9%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 918 in epi-week 49.
- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- ➤ Today (25/12/2021), 435 calls were answered.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 25 December 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 88 889 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 23 112 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 16 823 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 167 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 14 106 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of twenty (20) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center & Oshana Med Laboratory.
- To date, 862 436 tests (including 16 658 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 155 930 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified,
 96 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 4 regions.
- Cumulatively, 151 254 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 26 601 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 63 (2%) out of 3 003 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 25 December 2021
