- A daily increase of confirmed cases continue to be observed with concern and among them, majority are still not vaccinated. In the same vein we continue to observe increased hospitalized cases including those in ICU.
- > A total of 146 459 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 6% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 77 832 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 999 (3%) are Health Workers, with 12 new confirmations today.
 - 4 197 (84%) State; 794 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 579 (92%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 88.6%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 49 039 (34%) and 21 296 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 300 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 313 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The case fatality rate now stands at 2.5%.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 26 December 2021

- The highest peak of 12 787 (9%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 939 in epi-week 50.
- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (26/12/2021), 408 calls were answered.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 26 December 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 89 057 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 23 159 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- ➤ A total of 16 893 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 175 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 14 175 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of twenty (20) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center & Oshana Med Laboratory.
- To date, 863 517 tests (including 16 699 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 156 097 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 167 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 3 regions.
- Cumulatively, 151 756 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 26 755 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 470 (17%) out of 2 668 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 26 December 2021

Slow vaccine uptake among members of the public, and circulation of anti-vaccination information.


RECOMMENDATIONS
