- > A total of 166 006 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 6% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 88 266 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 5 688 (3%) are Health Workers, with 2 new confirmed today.
 - 4 781 (84.4%) State; 898 (15.4%) Private, 9 (0.1%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 5 674 (100%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 97%.
- > Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 54 574 (33%) and 23 749 (14%) respectively.
- > Of the total fatalities 3 711 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 347 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- > The case fatality rate now stands at 2.5%.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 22 June 2022




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 case, 22 June 2022

- The highest peak of 12 787 (8%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 3).
- The country has started seeing a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 1424 to 29 from epi-week 26 to 40 of 2021.
- Another peak of 7005 cases was recorded in week 50 of 2021
- The number of cases have started increasing again in the last three weeks as seen on the graph.
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (22/06/2022), 365 calls were answered.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 99 590 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 26 638 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 19 069 (11%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 687 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 17 022 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of twenty-three (23) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, NCP, Maerua MC, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center, Hosea Kutako International Airport & Oshana Med Laboratory .
- To date, 1 057 664 tests (including 19 516 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 176 570 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 28 contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- > Cumulatively, 173 996 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 299 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 29 201 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 508 (88%) out of 580 contacts were monitored.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 22 May 2022
