- A total of 166 513 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 7% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 88 523 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 5 711 (3%) are Health Workers, with 0 new confirmed today.
 - 4 798 (84.1%) State; 902 (15.8%) Private, 11 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 5 710 (100%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 97%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 54 716 (34%) and 23 843 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities 3 719 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 354 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The case fatality rate now stands at 2.4%.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 01 August 2022




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 case, 01 August 2022

- The highest peak of 12 787 (8%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 3).
- The country has started seeing a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 1424 to 29 from epi-week 26 to 40 of 2021.
- Another peak of 7005 cases was recorded in week 50 of 2021
- The number of cases have started decreasing in the last three weeks as seen on the graph.
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (01/08/2022), 270 calls were answered.

Table 4: Number of people in quarantine 01 August 2022

- Since March 2020, 97 854 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of **154** people are currently in quarantine, with **0** new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 99 864 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **26 695 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 19 131 (11%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 718 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 17 105 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of twenty-three (23) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, NCP, Maerua MC, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center, Hosea Kutako International Airport & Oshana Med Laboratory.
- To date, 1 070 543 tests (including 19 620 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 178 132 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 79 contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 175 754 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 300 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 29 276 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 129 (89%) out of 145 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 01 August 2022

RECOMMENDATIONS


- Encourage the public to get vaccinated and strengthen community health awareness to counteract anti-vaccination information in circulation.
