






Situation Report 69

Data update as of 05th December 2022 at 22:00 HRS




Background

On 20th September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan Ebola Virus (SVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This followed investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus

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Key Highlights

- days of responding to the EVD outbreak, and seven days since the last confirmed case.
- Within the past 24 hours, there was no new confirmed case or death registered, there was no recovery.



- Case Fatality Ratio (CFR) among confirmed cases still stands 55/142 (39%).
- A total of 36 contacts actively being followed-up in four districts, follow-up rate in the past 24 hours was 100%.

Actions to date

The Ministry of Health (MoH), Districts, and partners in Uganda are implementing several outbreak control interventions in Mubende and her surrounding districts to contain the disease spread. An overview of key activities is summarized below:

Burials

Key Updates in the past 24 hours

- Oumulative EVD-related evacuations in Kassanda, Mubende, KMA, Masaka and Jinja = 1,559; cumulative non-EVD evacuations in Mubende and Kassanda = 1,402.
- Within the past 24-hours, total of 21 death alerts verified from Mubende and Kassanda.
- Onducted 14 safe and dignified burials in Mubende, Kassanda within the past 24 hours and collected 19 samples.
- Backlog cases today were eight four alerts were received past working hours, three families were not yet ready and one burial pending results. All families contacted to arrange burials tomorrow.
- Oumulative SDBs conducted in Mubende: 355, in Kassanda: 262
- Team Mubende held an IPC meeting to map out IPC implementing partners.
- Team Kassanda mentored nine Private-for-Profit healthcare facilities in IPC / WASH, where 19 health workers were trained
- Team working on prepositioning 10 IPC kits in Mubende district stores to be distributed in case of a surge of EVD cases.
- Conducted an assessment of the Mubende A&E unit as potential holding area for suspected EVD cases.
- Drilling of a borehole at the proposed ETU in Kassanda commenced today
- At least 149 radio spots / messages continue to be aired daily through 11 radio stations in Kyegegwa 8, Kagadi 6, Kassanda 10, Kakumiro 10, Buyangabu 8 and Mubende 39, Masaka 13, Sembabule 13, Kazo 20, Kabarole 22).
- At least 1,840 EVD posters both adult and child friendly IEC and 2,650 leaflets were distributed in Kyegegwa and Jinja.
- Team Kyegegwa sensitized a total of 139 (16 Males, 123 females) congregates in churches
- RCCE team in Jinja conducted an EVD sensitization for private clinics and drug shop operators reaching 30 people (16 females & 14 Males) with EVD messages in Butagaya town council.
- RCCE team conducted a community dialogue with the index case and their family members in Kayalwe village that are stigmatized by the community reaching 4 (2 Males,2 Females) with EVD messages in Buyengo sub county in Jinja.
- RCCE teams in Jinja conducted health education sessions on EVD in Churches reaching 300 (20 Males & 280 Females) in Mafubira in Jinja City.
- RCCE teams in Jinja oriented Boda boda riders' leaders of Butagaya town council where 25 males reached with the EVD messages.
- RCCE team in Kampala using Faith Leaders & VHTs conducted mass sensitization in 33 Churches in Makindye Division reaching 6,853 Christians (2,957 Children).
- RCCE team in Jinja supervised two community drives in Butagaya sub county reaching 410 people.
- RCCE committee in Kagadi district reached 130 people (67 males & 63 female) through door to door outreaches in Ndaiga sub-county.
- RCCE team in Jinja Orientated 45 (28 Males & 17 Females) VHTs on basics of EVD, referral and data management in Buwabuzi parish, Buyengo sub county.
- Faith leaders and VHTs conducted mass sensitization in places of worship in Makindye Division and reached 33 Churches and reached 6,853 Christians and 2,957 children were sensitized on EVD during Sunday prayers. Churches visited are: St Koroli Catholic Church Gaba, Munyonyo C.O.U, Kansanga C.O.U, Visible Love Church in Wabigalo, Kansanga healing center, Nsambya railway church for Congolese nationals, St Peter's Church Nsambya, Greater Life Ministry among others.

Stock Status

- Sufficient PPE stock available in all districts to support IPC, Laboratory, SDB and Surveillance pillar activities.
- Reported low stocks of supportive medicines (Metoclopramide, Ondansetron, Metronindazole IV) in Mubende.

Orders and Deliveries

- Placed orders for IT needs to support Jinja and Masaka.
- Order needs placed to support IPC / WASH activities in KMA.

Food and Fleet Management

- Meals continuously provided in all ETUs.
- Ocompleted dry food distribution in Kassanda, Mubende and Jinja to families reported with EVD related fatalities, recoveries, quarantined household heads, and all patients still in the ETU.
- Sufficient fleet available to support response activities in all affected districts.

Key Updates in the past 24 hours

Mental Health & Psychosocial Social Support

- **ETU SUPPORT**: Psychosocial support offered to 24 clients at the Ngabano quarantine, Madudu and new ETU; Mubende team continues to support three medical students and two health workers in quarantine. All families updated on the status of their loved-ones currently admitted.
- **RESETTLEMENT:** Fifteen clients from Madudu, new ETU and Mubende emergency ward escorted back home after engaging the hosting communities.
- Team Kassanda conducted a home visit to five survivors at Nakasozi, Kikandwa, in Kalwana Sub County, senstised them about about safe sex practices and mentored them on good nutrition, regular exercise.
- **SURVIVOR FOLLOW-UP**: Clinic runs on Monday, Wednesday; Five survivors brought to the clinic for review and taken back home after receiving psychosocial support.

Key messages to the public

- People in the community should call an alert hotline or go to a health facility if they have symptoms (e.g., fever, headache, weakness, vomiting, bloody diarrhoea or urine, bleeding from body openings).

- Ommunity should not fear people who have been discharged from the ETU and returned home.
