

short coastline on the Atlantic Ocean. Mount Berongou is the highest point in the country at 903 meters. The Republic of Congo gained independence on 15 August 1960. The Republic of Congo has a presidential government, in which the President is elected by popular vote. The Council of Ministers is appointed by the president. Parliament is bicameral, consisting of a 66-seat Senate, in which members are elected by popular vote for terms, and a 137-seat National Assembly. The country is led by His Excellency Dennis Sassou - Nguesso, who was re-elected through presidential elections in 2021.

The Republic of Congo (sometimes called Congo-Brazzaville to distinguish it from the neighbouring Democratic Republic of Congo) is located in the central-western part of sub-Saharan Africa, along the equator, between latitudes 4° North and 5° South and longitudes 11° and 19° E. To the south and east of it is the Democratic Republic of Congo. It also shares borders with Gabon to the west, Cameroon and the Central African Republic to the north and Angola to the south-west.
