FIFTY-FOURTH WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY

1. The Fifty-fourth World Health Assembly lasted eight days.

Outcome of the Assembly

- 2. In her address to the Assembly, the Director-General started by describing this year as one of hope and declared that there were new reasons to be optimistic. She further described the Assembly as an opportunity to share experiences, define new steps and rally to the cause.
- 3. The Fifty-fourth World Health Assembly dealt with a heavy agenda which included review and approval of WHO's proposed programme budget for 2002-2003. Some of the items on the agenda of the Assembly were controversial, touching not just health concerns but also economic interests. Despite the complexity of some of the issues discussed, the meetings were conducted in a spirit of collaboration and cooperation among delegates.
- 4. Throughout the deliberations, the delegates looked for ways to build a united approach to fight some of the pressing public health problems such as HIV/AIDS and the ways of ensuring equitable access to essential medicine at affordable prices.
- 5. Indeed the debate on HIV/AIDS attracted great attention from delegates who sometimes, conveying with great feeling, their first-hand experiences of the social and economic devastation, described the human misery and premature deaths caused by this disease. The resolution *Scaling up the response to HIV/AIDS* was adopted by consensus.
- 6. The Secretary-General of the United Nations addressed a special plenary meeting and underscored the commitment of the entire UN system to fight the HIV/AIDS pandemic at all levels.

Ministerial Round Tables

- 7. The Ministerial Round Tables introduced at the 52nd World Health Assembly in order to enhance the involvement of the ministers and heads of delegations in policy debate has added value to the Assembly, making it possible to deal more effectively with the overall health agenda, and enabling the delegates to learn from one another.
- 8. This year, in the four Round Tables held concurrently on the theme: *Mental Health* (which was also the theme for this year's World Health Day), the ministers shared recent developments and approaches in mental health care in their respective countries. The ministers all agreed that mental health problems contributed to the global disease burden, have huge economic and social costs and cause human suffering and they expressed their commitment to dealing with the pressing mental health needs of their populations.
- 9. The current social context of mental health is a complex one since it is determined by a variety of factors in different countries: unemployment, family breakdown, poverty, political instability, physical and sexual violence against women, social upheavals and substance abuse.
- 10. In many parts of the world, mental health systems are poorly funded and organized and are ill-equipped to effectively treat mentally ill persons.
- 11. Ministers repeatedly called for urgent action to reduce stigmatization, discrimination and the violations of rights of people with mental illness since, these all reduce the effectiveness of care and they further agreed that mental health care should be integrated into the general health care system.

METHOD OF WORK AND DURATION OF THE FIFTY-FIFTH WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY

- 12. It is proposed to convene the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly on Monday, 13 May 2002 at the *Palais des Nations*, Geneva, and to close the Assembly no later than Saturday 18 May 2002.
- 13. In line with resolution WHA 52.21 on the reform of the Health Assembly by which the Director-General was requested to make appropriate arrangements for a shortened plenary meeting, delegates at the

Health assembly will be:

- (a) requested to limit, to five minutes, their statements in such debates;
- (b) encouraged to make group or regional statements;
- (c) invited to submit written statements of not more than 600 words for inclusion in the verbatim records of the plenary meeting in lieu of taking the floor.
- 14. Delegates wishing to have their names placed on the list of speakers for the general discussion should notify the Governing Bodies Department, fax number 41 22 791 4173.
- 15. Copies of statements to be made during the general discussion should be submitted to the Office of the Assistant to the Secretary of the Health Assembly by the morning of Monday, 13 May 2002.
- 16. World Health Report 2002 is on the theme: "*Risks of Health*". The theme for World Health Day is "*Fit for Health*". This will give particular visibility to ways in which individuals and communities can influence their own health and well-being.

Credentials

17. The credentials of delegates, alternates and advisers should be delivered to the Secretariat (Governing Bodies Department) by 26 April 2002. Credentials shall be issued by the Head of State, the Minister for Foreign Affairs, the Minister of Health, or any other appropriate authority. Member States shall be represented at the Assembly by not more than three delegates. Alternates and advisers may accompany delegates. Only original documents are examined and considered for formal credentials by the Committee on Credentials. Faxes and e-mails are not considered formal credentials but may be sent to the Governing Bodies Department (fax: +41 22 791 41 73; e-mail: credentials@who.int) for advance information prior to delivery of the original document. Credentials should include the following information for each participant: LAST NAME (in capital letters) first name, title, function, institution, city, gender (unless indicated in title).

Reimbursement of travel expenses

18. Resolution WHA 50.1 provides that only Members that are classified as least developed countries by the United Nations shall be reimbursed for the actual travelling expenses of one delegate each and, in accordance with WHO policy, only for travel by the most direct route.

Vice-President of the World Health Assembly

19. The African Region will designate a candidate for the post of Vice-President of the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly. In accordance with Decision 5 (3) of the 33rd session of the Regional Committee, the Chairman of the fifty-first session of the Regional Committee will be proposed to hold the office of Vice-President of the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly.

Member States entitled to designate persons to serve on the Executive Board

- 20. Following the usual English alphabetical order, Eritrea and Ethiopia designated representatives to serve on the Executive Board starting from its 108th session which took place immediately after the Fifty-fourth World Health Assembly. Eritrea and Ethiopia joined Chad, Comoros, Congo (Brazzaville), Cote d'Ivoire and Equatorial Guinea from the African Region.
- 21. The term of office of Chad, Comoros, Congo and Cote d'Ivoire will expire with the closure of the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly. They will be replaced by Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, and Guinea which will attend the 110th session of the Executive Board in May 2002.
- 22. Member States entitled to designate persons to serve on the Executive Board as from its 110th session should confirm their availability at least six weeks before the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly.

 23. The Fifty-first World Health Assembly, by its resolution WHA51.26, decided that Member States entitled to designate a representative to serve on the Executive Board should designate them as

government representatives technically qualified in the field of health.

MAIN COMMITTEES OF THE WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY

- 24. The Thirty-first World Health Assembly, by its resolution WHA 31.1, decided that:
 - (a) the terms of reference of Committee A shall be:
 - (i) to deal primarily with programme and budget matters;
 - (ii) to review the proposed programme budget and the Executive Board's report hereon:
 - (iii) to recommend the budget level and the appropriation resolution;
 - (iv) to consider the tentative budgetary projections for the following biennium and study such other items as shall be referred to it by the World Health Assembly (Rule 34);
 - (b) the terms of reference of Committee B shall be:
 - (i) to deal primarily with administrative, financial and legal matters;
 - (ii) to review WHO's financial position including: the Financial Report and the Report of the External Auditors; the status of contributions and advances to the Working Capital Fund; the status of any funds that have a bearing on WHO's financial position; and consideration of the amount of available casual income to be used to help finance the budget;
 - (iii) to recommend the sale of assessment; and
 - (iv) to study such other items as shall be referred to it by the World Health Assembly.
- 25. The Chairmen of these main committees shall be elected by the World Health Assembly after consideration of the Report of the Committee on Nominations.
- 26. Each main committee shall, after consideration of the report of the Committee on Nominations, elect two Vice-Chairmen and a Rapporteur.
- 27. Annex 4 to this report prepared for the information of members of the Committee on Nominations, shows the distribution by country of office-bearers at earlier health assemblies.
- 28. The Director-General, in consultation with the Regional Director shall, if necessary, consider before the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly, delegates of Member States of the African Region who may serve effectively as:
 - (a) Chairmen of the Main Committees A or B; and
 - (b) Vice-Chairmen and Rapporteurs of the Main Committees.

Informal meeting of the Regional Committee

- 29. Before the opening of the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly, the Regional Director will convene an informal meeting of the Regional Committee on Monday, 13 May 2002, at 8.30 a.m. at the *Palais des Nations*, Geneva. Information regarding the committee room where the meeting is to be held will be communicated in due course.
- 30. The informal meeting will confirm the decisions of the Regional Committee regarding Member States that will serve on the different committees of the World Health Assembly.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

31. In accordance with Executive Board resolution EB99.R28, the World Health Assembly, by its resolution WHA50.18, operative paragraph 2(1), decided that the Executive Board, when preparing the provisional agenda of each World Health Assembly, shall normally include individual technical programme items in that agenda as separate items only in the years when the World Health Assembly does not undertake a full review of the proposed biennial programme budget, thus allowing more time for discussing such technical items.

ANNEX 1

DRAFT PROCEDURAL DECISION

METHOD OF WORK AND DURATION OF THE FIFTY-FIFTH WORLD HEALTH ASSEMBLY

Vice President

1. The Chairman of the Fifty-first session of the Regional Committee for Africa will be designated as Vice President of the Fifty-fifth session of the World Health Assembly to be held in May 2002.

Main committees of the World Health Assembly

- 2. The Director-General, in consultation with the Regional Director will, if necessary, consider before each World Health Assembly, the delegates of Member States of the African Region who are to serve effectively as:
 - (a) Chairmen of the Main Committees A or B;
 - (b) Vice-Chairmen and Rapporteurs of the main committees.

Member States entitled to designate persons to service on the Executive Board

- 3. Following the usual English alphabetical order, Eritrea and Ethiopia designated persons to serve on the Executive Board starting from the 108th session of the Board which took place immediately after the Fifty-fourth World Health Assembly, joining Chad, Comoros, Congo (Brazzaville), Cote d'Ivoire and Equatorial Guinea from the African Region.
- 4. The term of office of Chad, Comoros, Congo and Cote d'Ivoire will expire with the closure of the Fifty-fifth Health Assembly. They will be replaced by Gabon, Gambia, Ghana and Guinea which will attend the 110th session of the Executive Board in May 2002.
- 5. The Member States entitled to designate persons to serve on the Executive Board should confirm their availability at least six weeks before the Fifty-fifth World Health Assembly.
- 6. The Fifty-first World Health Assembly, by resolution WHA51.26, decided that Member States entitled to designate a representative to the Executive Board should designate them as government representatives, technically qualified in the field of health.

Informal meeting of the Regional Committee

7. The Regional Director will convene this meeting on Monday, 13 May 2002, at 8.30 a.m. at the *Palais des Nations*, Geneva, to confirm the decisions taken by the Regional Committee at its Fifty-first session.
